

Stop AAPI Hate National Report



- March 2020-Sept 2021 = 10,370 incidents reported
- 1 in 5 Asian Americans (4.8 million), Pacific Islanders (320,000) experienced a hate incident in past year
- 1 in 3 Asian American parents reported incidents against their kids
- Types
- Verbal harassment 63% of incidents
- Shunning & avoidance 16%
- Physical assault 16%
- Civil rights & denial of service 11.3%
- Online harassment 8.6%
- Typically in public streets (32%) and businesses (27%)
- Majority reported by women 62%










- Prior to 1990:
 - Asamen and Berry (1987)
- Between 1990 and 1999: 6
- Between 2000 and 2009: 55
- Between 2010 and 2019: 162
- Between 2020 and 2021: ~74


Main Lessons



- Pathogenic: Discrimination has a significant and adverse impact on mental health, health and health behaviors
- Environment-Health Linkage: Affirms the importance of the linkage between the sociopolitical, environmental context and one's health
- Beyond Microaggressions: Racism ≠ microaggressions
- Systemic: Challenge us to examine the role of institutions & communities (policies, practices, allocation of resources, etc.)
- Role of Advocacy: Challenges us to shift our attention to the sociopolitical context
